The **SCOUT HANDSHAKE** is made with the hand nearest the heart and is offered as a token of friendship.

Extend your left hand to another Scout and firmly grasp his left hand.

Only use this handshake when both people are in uniform.



The **SCOUT SIGN** shows you are a Scout. Give it each time you recite the Scout Oath

and Law. When a Scout or Scouter raises the Scout sign, all Scouts should make the sign, too, and come to silent attention.
